HOME LEARNING – READING AND SPELLINGS

ENGLISH

MATHS

In Year 3 Maths we start the year by looking at the following units: 'Adding and subtracting across 10, Numbers to 1000, Measures and Mass and Securing Mental Calculations. We will also focus on remembering our 2,5 and 10 times table facts.
